TMZ Posts Photo It Claims is a Beaten Rihanna

LOS ANGELES (AP) — A photo that appears to be Rihanna's face with bruises, scratches and swelling from an attack allegedly at the hands of boyfriend Chris Brown was posted Thursday night by the celebrity Web site TMZ.

The close-up image shows a welt above each of the woman's eyebrows, marks on her cheek and around her lips, and general swelling. TMZ did not say how it obtained the photo, when it was taken or by whom.

Hours after the photo was posted, the Los Angeles Police Department launched an inter-nal investigation and asked for the public's help in finding the on who leaked it. A police news release said the image "has the appearance" of one taken during a domestic violence investigation, and classified its release as a case of serious mis conduct that could result in ter-mination.

Asked earlier Thursday

whether he could confirm the photo's origin. LAPD Officer Jason Lee said only that the department had not released images of the woman who accused Brown, and would not release evidence photos. A spokeswoman for the district attorney said all evidence related to the case was still with police.

Brown was arrested Feb. 8 and booked on suspicion of making felony criminal threats to a woman that authorities have not publicly identified. A person familiar with the situation, who was not authorized to speak publicly on the matter and requested anonymity, confirmed that the woman was Rihanna.

The person said some of the injuries shown in the photo -specifically the marks on the woman's forehead - were con-sistent with the injuries Rihanna







Family Of Man Cleared By DNA Still Seeks Justice

"Then all of a sudden, he just opened the door of my car and forced himself in and then he put a kinfe to my throat at the same time," says Mallin, who is white. "He pushed me over into the passenger seat and started to drive away and started telling me, Stop screaming," because I was screaming my head off, 'or I'm going to kill you."

Mallin feared for her bife as the man drove her out of Lubbock to a vacant lot. But she was strong, athletic, a virgin—and determined to stay that way.

"I just couldn't fight him," she says. "As much as I tried, I couldn't He was just stronger than me physically."

Her attacker had one very distinguishing characteristic. "He smoked the whole time," she says she told authorities "from the get-go."

A chain-smoking, African-American rapist who used a knife. That was the man the Lubbock police should have been looking for But it was a nonsmoking, asthmatic black man they eventually settled on.

No Physical Evidence

Cole had enrolled at Texas Tech for the 1985 spring semes-ter. One of his friends worked at a Mr Gatti's pizza parlor near campus, and Cole would often wait for him there. The restaurant was just a few blocks from where Mallin was raped. The



"Yeah, I was pretty confi-dent, I never really wavered," Mallin says. "I really honestly

believed that they found the right guy and I had picked out the right guy." She says she assumed the police had other physical evidence.

But there were holes in the prosecution's case. No physical evidence tied Cole to the crime.
