





Blacks Match Whites in Voting Rates in 2008

WASHINGTON (AP) — Nearly one-fourth of voters in last November's election were minorities, the most diverse minorities, the most diverse election ever, fueled by high turnout from black women and a growing Hispanic population, an independent research group

The study by the Pew Research Center, released Thursday, also showed that for the first time blacks had the highest voter turnout rate of any highest voter turnout rate of any racial or ethnic group among people ages 18 to 29. Analysts said it remained to be seen how fully the strong minority participation, a reflection of both chianging U.S. demographics and enthusiasm for Democrat Barack Obarna, would carry over to future elections.

Obama Seeks to Change Crack Sentences



WASHINGTON (AP) The Obama administration joined a federal judge Wednesday in urging Congress to end a racial disparity by equalizing prison sentences for dealing and using crack versus powdered cocume.

"Iails are loaded with people who look like me," U.S. District Judge Reggie Walton, an African-American, told a Senate

African-American, told a Senate Judiciary subcommittee hearing. Assistant Attorney General Lanny Breuer said the administration believes Congress' goal "should be to completely eliminate the disparity" between the two forms of cocaine. "A growing number of citizens view it as fundamentally unfair," Breuer jestified.

It takes 100 times more pow-dered cocaine than crack cocaine to trigger the same harsh mandatory minimum sen-

Sen, Dick Durbin, an Illinois Sen. Dick Durbin, an Illinois Democrat who chairs the sub-committee, said, "Under current law, mere possession of five grams of crack - the weight of five packets of sweetener - car-ries the same sentence as distri-bution of half a kilogram of powder or 500 packets of sweet-ener."

Durbin said more than 81 percent of those convicted for crack offenses in 2007 were African-American, although only about 25 percent of crack cocaine users are African
