

## Obama signs health care 'fixes' bill

Washington (CNN) - Pres

Washington (CNN) — President Obama sealed a final victory on his signature domestic priority Tuesday, March 30, 2010, signing a sweeping package of changes to the newly enacted health care reform law.

The so-called "fixes" bill—approved over unanimous Republican opposition in both chambers of Congress—significantly expands health insurance subsidies for lower- and middleincome families while watering down a tax on expensive health down a tax on expensive health

The measure also overhauls the national college student loan system by shifting government funding for loans away from commercial banks to new education initiatives. Until now, commercial banks have received federal subsidies to provide stufederal subsidies to provide stu-

dent loans.

The bill increases the overall cost of the health care reform legislation to \$940 billion over the next 10 years, \$65 billion







### Gospel, Blues Singer Marva Wright Dead at 62

NEW ORLEANS (AP) -New Orleans blues and gospe singer Marva Wright died Tues day at age 62, her former man ger said. Adam Shipley onfirmed that Wright died of

She sang traditional jazz and gospel standards but was better known for sultry, sometimes bawdy blues songs. Among her best known songs were "Heartbreakin' Woman" and "Mama, He Treat your Doubles Mana,

She released a series of al-bums on local and international record labels, and frequently performed in Europe and at blues festivals around the coun-try. With her band, the BMWs, she drew large crowds for per-formances at the New Orleans Jazz and Heritage Festival. As a child, Wright listened to

her mother sing and play piano at church. Among her childhood memories were visits to Chicago, the adopted home of New Orleans gospel great Ma-halia Jackson, who had grown up with Wright's mother. "My mother would go to the pational Bantist convention"

national Baptist convention," Ms. Wright once said, according to an account in The Times-Picayune newspaper. "When it Picayune newspaper.
