## An Open Letter To Black Voters

"Upset Over Jackson Delegates"

Dear Editor

What follows is an open letter to the Jackson voters of Lubbock County Before I begin let me state that I am writing this letter as an individual delegate scho was on the floor of the Texas State Democratic Convention held this last weekend in Houston. This latter should in no way be construed as an official statement from any organization. It is my private opinion, and any receation should be addressed to me alone.

in beginning this letter let me explain some of the conditions that existed this weekend. The 28th Senatorial District was allowed three delegates to the national convention. Under the rules of the Democratic Party of the State of Texas a candidate must command twenty percent of the delegates for a give district in order to send a pleage delegate to the national convention, the Jackson delegates made up only thirteen percent of the 28th district. They had two alternatives it they were to have a voice in the choosing of national delegates. They could try to bring enough delegates to their side to make twenty percent, or they could re-align and vote for delegates to go under the name of a different

The Jackson people wanted to gain enough votes to make the twenty percent. This turned out to be impossible. The Hart delegation offered the Jackson people a compromise. If the Jackson people re-aligned with Hart, the resulting group could attract enough votes to claim two of the three delegates from our district. In return the Hart delegation promised to vute for a lackson supporter for one of the two positions. This delegate, while officially pledged to Hart, could have signed in at the national convention as a Jackson supporter. They could vote for Jesse

Jackson, and support his organization in every way. It was a pood deal. The Jackson people from the 28th district thought it was a good deal. The Jackson organizers from the state level thought it was a good deal. The Jackson delegation from Lubbook County refused. They could not get the pledged delegate they wanted, and they were previlling to compromise for anything else. In the end they wait a out of the convention without voting at all.

The Jackson voters from Lubbook County were silenced. If the Jac'son delegation had been willing to compromise, the Jackson voters of this county could have been heard clear to San Francisco. A person could have gone to the national convention to carry their voice, and represent their interest. Even if the Jackson delegation had broken up, and nach individual had re-aligned as they saw fit, the voice of Lackson voters would have had an effe. I on the delegates who were eventually elected By walking from the floor of the convention the lackson forces from Lubboch County deprived their candidate of a delegate, and deprived their constituents of a voice.

It seems to me that the actions of the Lubbock County Jackson delegation were in opposition to the goals of the Jackson candiacy, Jesse Jackson has tried to give people a veice who have never been involved in the democratic process before. He has repeatedly worked on registration drives, and pointed with pride to the numbers of new votors he is bring og into the system. The people who believed in the promise the Jackson campaign put their trust in these people to carry their write to Houston. The Jackson delegation of Lubbock County, in my opinion. violated that trust and failed to give their constituents the representation thuy deserve.

While a do not support Jesse Jackson for president, I do support the lackson candidacy. The minorities of this country have been excluded from the political process for har too long, I agree with the Reverend tackson when he says that all the people must have a voice in the

## **Hooks Depiores** Supreme Court Firefighters Job Case Ruling

Washington -- NAACP Executive Director on Luesday deplored the opinion of the U.S. Supreme court in the Momphis Firefighters affirmative action case. In his statement on June 12:

Mr. Hooks said: This is a dark day in the annals of civil rights and the struggle to remove racial barriers in employment and other areas of society. By its 63 judement in Firelighters v. Stotts, the United States Supreme court has pulled the rug out from under affirmative action and the Federal Courts which have been earnestly seeking to uphold the law and the Construction.

What the court said, in effect, was that present hard times or future deteriorating financial conditions can take precedence over remedial steps Instituted to include those persons who have been traditionally locked out. Additionally, the opinion provides

a backeoor method for communities that have adhered to distriminatory practices to avoid remedies for their misdeeds. It could reverse many affirmative action programs which are already in place and will stop completion of similarly contemplated actions The High Court has regrettably

upheld the "last bired, first fired" doctrine in a nation that has had a history of excluding classes of people because of race, creed and sex in a very questionable thanner. The court has joined the Reagan 3dministra" on in leading the nation to turn its backs on those groups and classes who have long suffered such throwback, á voll back and a jump back to darker periods in the courtry's race relations.

We find it especially troubling that the court made such a momentous judgement on a case that was moot. The Memphis Firefighters

judgement is close in impact to the Plessy v. Terguson judgement which established the separate but equal" doctrine and gave constitutional saction to second class citizenship for Blacks in 1896. Even though the court's opinion in the Memphis Firefighters case was limited to the provisions of Title VII of the 1964 Civil Rights, Act, it will have very chilling impact on civil rights enforcement programs. The opinion is equally reminiscent of the Dredd Scott decision which held that wacks had no rigists that whites were bound to

For what the Supreme Court has said to the nation is that racial discrimination in the workplace is alive and well. White employers are free to protect the jobs of whites at the expense of morally sound affirmative action programs. Lower Federal courts have n o logal ocligation to remedy the effects of past racial discrimination in areas involving seniority rules.

The United States Surreme Court has kicked aside morality and sound rasoning to make bad law. If has rendered an advisory



opinion that was not based on evidence. This shametess action compounds the wrong interpretation of civil rights laws that the court had mode earlier this year in the Grove City College case that involved Title VI of the 964 Civil Rights Act. The court by this two judgments has destroyed much of the law through which Blacks had apped to achieve equality in employment and other areas of

The Court has clearly sided with the forces of Injustice and with the Reagan administration in working to demolish the foundations of sound law and understanding upon which Title VII of the 1964 Civil Rights Act was created. The court princedly overlooked the fact that although Title VII bars quotas it expressly

sanctions affirmative action. The court's action, as Justice Blackmun makes clear in his dissent, is so grossly faulty. We believe, as Justice Blackmun said, that "Today's opinion is troubling less for the law its creates than for the law it

That is a very sad example that the High Court has set for the lower courts, municipalities and private employers. Political shemanigans and racial injustice are the rules of the day when it comes to equality for Blacks. precedents be dagmed Racists through the land are rejoicing and having a-field day.





#### Guest Editorial:

Mass Media: Believe It Or Not Abdul Wall Muhammad

My answer to the above question is "emphatically no," for now we have seen the negative image the American white media has attempted to paint of Rev. Jesse Lackson, and Minister Louis Farrakhan in addition

to the job that they began to do on Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. when he stepped outside the bounds of civil rights issues. Yet, we know better. I wan't dwell on the redemptive work that Rev. 'esse Jackson is doing jethe Black community, actually bringing hope to a people on the brink of total despair. Hor will I dwell on Minister Farrakhan's true image, role and message for the black community. But I will say that we should know in the black community that both of these men, although holding different individual approaches to our problem, share a deep love and commitment to Black people, and oppressed people all over the world.



Church Leaders Increase

Attention to Black Families

In quict and not-so-quiet discussions around the country, Black church leaders are beginning to take a closer look at the plight of Black families and children. One such teader is Dr. Mary Rosa, a distinguished graduate of Spelman College and president of the more than three million strong Woman's Convention. Auxiliary of the National Baptist Convention, U.S.A., Inc.

This year Dr. Ross has raised a strong voice ungling greater Baptist leavership on and attention to the needs of Black families. She has particularly studied out the problem of children having children. The Baptists have gone on record to make strengthening Black families one of the Convention's top priorities, and Dr. Ross has been a key participant in a network of Black woman across the United States who are beginning to confront the problem of twon-age pregnancy and the growing proverty of single-parent households.

"We are going to have to play the role of helping our young people dare to be different," Dr. Ross has said to me, explaining that the church hasp't said nearly as much as it should about issues such as teall-age sexuality. "So many ministers haven't even thought about sex education, and it ought to be included in the church's role."

According to Dr. Ross, many of the churches still don't know how to handle young pregnant girls in their own concregations. "What are we going to do? This girl has had a baby. Should she go back into the

Although statistics show teen pregnancy rates have declined in our es.nmunity, teen pregnancy is still a monumental problem that the church cannot afford to ignore. More than one out of every four Black babies born is to a teen-age mother. Every year, among all unwed Black 15-17 years olds one out of 14 has a haby. This is a major contributing cause to single-parent households and to growing child poverty.

Today 55% of all Black babies are being born to never married single women. Children living in these families are three times more likely to he poor than those living in two-parent households.

Dr. Ross says churches should be offering young people confidential workshops and seminars, run by professionals, in which they could deal with the question of sex, because too many of us parents have been unable to talk with our children about these issues. I agree. I'm raising three boys of my own, and I still have trouble beginning the conversation that I know are needed. Dr. Ross also favors churches establishing homes for young mothers who need to leave how to be parents and how to avoid being parents again before they're 20 years

in addition to learning how to communicate with our young people about sexual responsibility, Dr. Ross believes that we must "bring out of them the best thinking about themselves. I think one of the reasons for teen-age pregnancy is that young people don't really know how to

respect thamselves. According to Dr. Ross, churches need to help term-agers understand rights within the family but also their responsibilities to the family and the community. "Children today need respect for their parents," sile

Like my own parents, Dr. Ross's parents were devout Christians who encouraged the family to worship and talk together. And she and her siblings were raised by an extended family that was familiar to all of us who grew up in the South.

"My family was not the only family interested in us," Dr. Ross says. "there was a woman up the street whom I was afraid of. And I knew my mother talked to her, if we had done anything wrong, she would be telling my mother all about it" "I think to revive that kind of caring really would be helpful."

#### You Are Quite Normai

Have you ever been ashamed of your behavior? Have you ever done something and then said, "Did I really do that? Am I going craz,?" Many people question their own behavior and, reluctantly go to a psychologist or sanitatrist for evaluation and help. After explaining their questionable behavior, the asychologist often says: "Let's set up another appointment for you." The mere fact that the psychologist proposes another appointment practically serves as an indictment or the individual's behavior and, to the individual, confirms his fears that he

The fact is that very few people who visit psychologists are "crazy." Indeed, the behavior may not even be abnormal. The victim thinks that it as abnormal merely because he does not observe other people acting the same way he acta. But lew people who think that their behavior is abnormal will teil other people about it because they do not wish to be considered to be "nutty." these, while many thousands of people carry out certian kinds of behavior that is probably normal, they think that it is aunormal simply because other people at not talk about it. They go to psychiatrists or psychologists and pay thousands or dollars for "help" when they are perfectly normal. The only think about them is that they thick they are abnormal. But since nearly everyors thinks he is: abnormal, even this thinking is normal.

Although everyone probably should have an annual esychological checkup (just as one should have a physical checkup) to get a fresh perspective on our lives. Most people (perhaps as many as 90%) who are udged to be abnormal are, in fact, quite normal. Our suggestibility is the most imposing factor on our behavior. Let's examine this thesis for validity. Advertisers often manipulate our behaviour and get us to do what they want us to do by means of suggestions. They create within us habitual behavior that makes us respond to advertisements emotionally. When they show someone drinking soda, we get a thirst for it. When they show someone crying, we feel an urge to cry also. Televion can create practically any emotion. So when we see the soda in a grocery store we automatically reach for it, this habitual, almost cwapulsive behavior is often beyond our control and we interpret these uncontrollable compulsions 4s our "craziness."

But what is crazy behavior? Are you crazy if you are afraid to fly? Are you crazy if vu have a fear of water, height, dogs, snakes or large Eugs? This is prohably normal behavior. Fractically everyone is afraid of something so you could not categorize this behavior, indeed, the word crazy is saldom used by professionals because it is too broad in meaning to be useful. Or maybe everyone is a little bit crary. This makes the

A person could perhaps regitimately be categorized as abnormal if they lost the ability to distinguish between their thoughts and reality. For instance, if a gerson daydreamed about being chased by a moster and actually began to scream and run blindly down the street in fright, his behavior might be considered to be abnormal, if this were consistent behavior. (This might be termed exychatic behavior).

If you occasionally lose control of yourself, you are probably under stress. You should seek a stress-management courselor instead of a psychiatrist. Your physician can probably advise you. Be sure to ask about the positive and negative impact of any medicine that you are tolo to take.





#### Would Throw Us To Jogs of Prolitoers

WYork City-Nev. Or. Everett C. Parker, Adjunct Professor. Communications, Fordham University, has vociferously joined forces with these citizens speaking out agianst governo ental deregulation of the electronic meduim. Before an all ears audience at a Public Interest Telecommunication dinner April past, he offered a speech laced with charges and dire warnings. To prick your interest and ring your alarm bell of freedom we take the liberty of quoting some of what he said.

"Exerting influence on communications policy has always been an uphill battle. I have been dealing with the ECC since 1935. Only in rare instances, as when Clifford Durr and Frieda Hernock were commissioners, have we had a commission majority that was not indifferent, or downright hostile to assertions or rights of the public. Congress has legislated at the behest of commercial interests, largely to anchance their ability to make profit. The communications Ace basically codified what was already a fact—the commercial control of radio. It has no consumer protection elements, other than the guarantee of airness. Nevertheless, the Communications Act is flexible enough to deal with new technologies as they come along, as long as everybody plays by the rules. And that includes government."

"Deregulation and its corollary dognia, Let the marketplace decide," are truly radical concepts. Together, they are the most revolutionary elements in what we are calling the communication revolution. They pose a diabolical threat to our individual and social libertier. The FCC is moving to put concrol of bradcasting into fewer hands and less responsible hands. 'Get as much as you want and we don't care what kind of character you have," the FCC majority is saying. It seems incredible that anyone would think of abandoning honesty and integrity and prerequisition for running any business much less a broodcasting stateion. You would expect even Edward Frits to jump up and cry, 'Mark! Hold! Enough! rince he isn't, it is incumbent on churches and other public groeps that value ethics in government and business to blow the whistle. Sound the public accept the FEC's premis of constitutional freedom, it will lose control over communication and thus risk losing its

if we are not careful most people will not learn about these radical FCC activities until an unscroupulous station operator appears in their home town or a single entity gets control of all or most of their communications outlets. Then it will be to late."

"Between now and November we have ample time to apply the enors—as influence of our membership of churches, unions, education, civic and cultural organizations to get firm pledges that the next Congress will address communication: I sees from the standpoint of the whole citizency, n of just that or industry trade associations. Congress needs to be presunded to return the FCC its proper sphere as a subordinate cody to the congress. And, to order that the public interest standards and public trusteesh:p status that now govern broadcasting applied to cable-Tv and to the new communications technologies that are about to burst upon us. About all, congress should assure that First Arcandment protection is provided universally on the principle laid dok-it by the Supreme Court in Virginia State Board of Pharamcy, 'to the cation, to its source and to its recepient both.' Remember, it is neever fruitless to speak out for fiarness and freedom."

Washington D'C .-- A congressional committee 'today heard evidence that the Iranian government is conducting a confidential program to identify Baha'i primary and secondary school children and their fathers.

Representatives of the American Baha'i community, te-ofying before the House oreign Affairs Subcommittee on Human Rights and International Organizations, called the government's demand for schools to furnish Baha'i students photographs and birth certificates the latest example of Iran's religious persecution of Baha'is, the largest religious minority in Iran.

The Iranian government has also banned all organized Baha'i religious activities as "criminal" acts, and has executed more than 170 Baha'is, Judge James F. Nelson, Live elected Chairman of

Iran's repression of the Baha'i minority is based upon theologicval differences between the Baha'i faith and Islam. "The authorities of the Islamic Republic have relentlessly pursued their cruel aim of extinuiting the Baha'i faith from the land of its birth, either through forced conversion of th eR ha'is to Shi'ite islam or through their extermination." Judge Netson said.




