ACORN stalt, ACORN CEO-Bertha Lewis made the follow-ing announcement Wednesday morning "As a result of the indefensi-ble action of a handful of our employees, I am, in consultation with ACORN's Executive Comwith ACORN's Executive Com-mittee, immediately ordering a halt to any new intakes into ACORN's service programs until completion of an independ-ent review. I have also commu-nicated with ACORN's independent Advisory Council, and they will assist ACORN in partness as independent auditor. thorough review of all of the or-ganizations relevant systems and processes. That reviewer, to be named within 48 bours, will make recommendations directly to me and to the full ACORN Board. We enter this process with a commitment that all rec-ommendations will be imple-

These pathogens can cause recurring illness if not diagnosed and treated appropriately by a physician, especially in young children. Children and young adults in school and daycare settings are often more at risk being expected by these orthogony in their posed to these pathogens in their

Preventive measures are paramount in reducing the risk of gastro-intestinal illness, especially in situations where many persons share the same space. This would include

-frequent and thorough handwashing, especially after toileting and before eating

-thorough cleaning of hands soiled surfaces and clothing when changing diapers or caring for incontinent persons

-not sharing food, drinks or utensits with others, especially someone who has been ill.

Injunction Allows **HBCU** to Maintain Standing

DALLAS (NNPA) - Paul DALLAS (NNPA) - Paul Quinn College won a temporary yet significant battle in prevent-ing the college from having its accreditation removed by the Southern Association of Col-leges and Schools, Inc. (SACS). Attorneys for the school secured a preliminary injunction that al-lows it to maintain its current ac-creditation status.

The document from the At-

lanta Division of the United States District Court stated:
"Paul Quinn College ... is hereby reinstated to membership in the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges, Inc., (SACS-COC), in the same status it was in immediately before the action

to remove it; that is, as a member on Probation."

The injunction is pending until the final outcome and resolution of Paul Quinn's case will be resolved. It's not sure at this point of what further actions will be taken by SACS or the North District Court. The injunction will allow Paul Quinn to remain accredited during the pendency of its litigation against SACS— challenging efforts to remove accreditation from the 137-yearold college. As a result of the Aug. 27 order, Paul Quinn may continue to award degrees and distribute federal financial aid to

students. Fall classes will begin as planned on October 5. "The injunction allows Paul Quinn to continue serving stu-dents and the community in its dents and the community in its full capacity, and represents an-other step toward securing the long-term future of this college," said William A. Brewer III, part-ner at Bickel & Brewer Storefront and lead counsel for Paul Quinn. The law firm filed the in-junction on Aug. 25 in Atlanta The accreditation dispute in-volving Paul Quinn has become

among the most closely watched cases in higher education. SACS' Commission on Colleges notified the school on June 25 that it was removing it from membership in the organization and that decision was affirmed by an appeals committee on Au gust 24.

The following day, the Bickel & Brewer Storefront filed a law-suit in Atlanta federal district court and a motion seeking a temporary restraining order and





In Cinque

Every day, it appears that the most discussed conversation is low many people in this country do not have medical coverage. There is the statistical count of how many people above the poverty line do not have coverage, and how many people there are below the poverty line that do not have medical coverage. do not have medical coverage. These figures are always given in percentages of the total population. The problem I find, is that they always fail to tell us where the poverty line is. I have read articles and decided to find our where its forces of the poverty line is.

articles and decided to find out where it is for my self.

1 checked the U.S. Census Bureau and they quoted for the year 2008, figures which are approximately ten years old in citing levels of income related to family size, and the number of children under 18 years of age in a home. Poverty for a family of four people with three children is about \$22,000. If you are under 65 years of age and have

no children, and your income is no more than \$11,201, you are living in poverty. If you are over 65 years of age, and no children, less than \$19,326 would put you in the poverty category. A couple with no children is classified as in poverty if their income is \$13,014, and if there is a child under 18 years of age in the home, the poverty live is \$14,784. Poverty for a family of eight people when seven are under 18 years of age is \$35, 125.

It is understandable why the various reporting sources will not quote the poverty figure because they would have to break it down into categories, but the usual figure considered the standard for deciding general poverty is the one used for a family of four, which is \$22,000 per year income. We all are aware that figures quoted years ago are not really relevant. years ago are not really relevant now but will have to suffice as newer figures have not been given us. With today's prices.

newer figures have not been given us. With today's prices, we may very well be in poverty if our incomes are below the figure quoted for a family of four. When we consider the poverty line and the amount of monthly Social Security grants, most working Americans are expected to live in poverty when they retire. Individuals who receive SSI or the Supplemental Security Income are kept in






