### Absentee Ballots Available Now

Absentee balloting for the Special Election for a United States Senator began Wednesday, March 13 and will continue through 5:00 p.m., March 29.

Voters wishing to vote absentee ballots may vote at the County Clerk's office and ballots are available now.

A list of 23 applicants will appear on the official ballot according to County Clerk Charles D. Jones.

This election will be held in conjunction with the Earth City Election on April 2.

School children of the Springlake Schools will be offered Salk Vaccine shots free of charge. The shots will be given due to the efforts of the doctors and nurses throughout Lamb County.

Physicians and nurses of Lamb County are cooperating in a national program, endorsed by the American Medical Association, to attempt to inoculate all persons under 40 years before the polio season begins.

Clinic will be set up in the Springlake Schools in early April where Dr. Faust and other county doctors will work in pairs to give the first two shots to all school-age children.

Slips will be given the school children to take home asking parents permission for the shots to be given. The questionnaires will contain the following statements, one of which the parents should check:

- 1.—My child has had Shot 1 and 2.
  - 2.—My child has had Shot 1.
  - 3.—You have my permission to give my child both shots.
  - 4.—I do not want my child to have the Salk shots.
- Parents are requested to return these slips as soon as possible, so the amount of vaccine needed can be determined.

The first two shots will be given this spring, the first shot as soon as the vaccine arrives, and the second one four to six weeks later. The third shot will be the responsibility of the parent, and should be given in seven or eight months.

The primary aim of the American Medical Society Program is to persuade all people to get the protection of the salk vaccine before the 1957 polio season begins.
